Household hazardous waste is any product found in your home, yard or garage that can cause harm to human health or the environment when improperly managed. Reduce the amount of hazardous product you buy. Buy only what you can use entirely. Read labels for warnings and disposal instructions.

THURSDAY, Sept 24 Households that need later hours: 3:00-7:00 p.m.

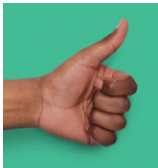
FRIDAY, Sept. 25 Households with flexible schedules: noon-5:00 p.m.

FRIDAY, Sept. 25 Businesses, Churches & Farms: 9:00-11:30 a.m.

Households: Households do not need to pre-register.

Businesses / Churches: To be eligible to participate, businesses must generate less than 220 lbs. of hazardous waste per month to qualify as a very small quantity generator (VSQG). The business/church collection is a fee-based service event. **Pre-registration is required by Thursday, Sept. 17th at 3 pm.** Call 715-531-1907 or download the form from our website and email it in.

Farms: The first 500 lbs. of qualifying hazardous waste is free. Fees for paint and stain will apply. **Pre-registration is required by Thursday, Sept. 17th at 3 pm.** Call 715-531-1907 or download the form from county website and email it in.

- Furniture & floor wax stripper
- Shellac, varnish

REMEMBER...

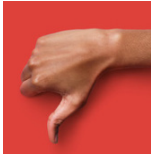
This event is held only once this year. If you cannot attend, ask a neighbor or others in the community for help bringing materials to the event. Lines can get long, so combine your efforts.

These items will NOT BE ACCEPTED

PRODUCT	SAFE DISPOSAL METHOD
CAR and AUTOMOTIVE CARE PRODUCTS	
Antifreeze	Bring to participating auto service centers (check county website)
Batteries (automotive)	Bring to participating battery retailer (check county website) Bring to county APPLIANCE collection event Sept 19
Motor oil (used)	Bring to participating auto service centers (check county website)
Windshield washer	Flush with lots of water and pour in a city/village sanitary sewer
Tires	Bring to participating tire service centers (check county website) Bring to a county TIRE collection event Sept 19
HOUSEHOLD CLEANING PRODUCTS	
<i>* Never mix products containing ammonia with those containing bleach.</i>	
Cleaner with ammonia *	Flush with lots of water and pour in a city/village sanitary sewer (not in a rural septic system or storm drain)
Cleaner with bleach *	Flush with lots of water and pour in a city/village sanitary sewer (not in a rural septic system or storm drain)
Disinfectants	Flush with lots of water and pour in a city/village sanitary sewer (not in a rural septic system or storm drain)
HOME IMPROVEMENT PRODUCTS	
Adhesives/glues - WATER-BASED	Air-dry or mix with cat litter until solid, then place in regular trash
Caulk, grout, putty, spackle	Air-dry or mix with cat litter until solid, then place in regular trash
PESTICIDES, WEED KILLERS and POISONS	
Fertilizer WITHOUT weed killer	Use on other plants and planted areas. If disposing, air-dry or mix with cat litter until solid, then place in regular trash
PRESSURIZED CONTAINERS	
<i>Can explode under heat or pressure and should be kept out of regular waste collection.</i>	
Propane tanks (refillable)	Re-use and refill at supplier. If disposing of tank, keep sealed. Bring to county APPLIANCE collection event Sept 19
Propane tanks (small, single-use, non-refillable)	Use entire contents of tank so that it is empty. Bring to county APPLIANCE collection event Sept 19
Spray foam insulation cylinders	Once completely empty, bring to a scrap metal recycler
MISCELLANEOUS ITEMS	
Empty hazard containers	Once completely emptied, put containers in regular trash
Appliances	Bring to local retailer for recycling (check county website) Bring to county APPLIANCE collection event Sept 19
Electronics	Bring to local retailer for recycling (check county website) Bring to county ELECTRONIC collection event Sept 19
Medical, biological waste, Sharps	Check with your local hospitals or medical clinics
Explosives	Gunpowder, ammunition & fire-works (bring to local police/sheriff)
ACCEPTED at Clean Sweep, but have year-round disposal options	
Latex Paint - WATER-BASED	Air-dry or mix with cat litter until solid, then place in regular trash \$5/gallon and \$25/5-gallon pail fee at Clean Sweep
Compact & fluorescent tubes	Bring to local retailer for recycling (check county website) Bring to county APPLIANCE collection event Sept 19
Thermostats & Smoke Detectors	Check county website for drop-off location Bring to county APPLIANCE collection event Sept 19

Consider saving or reusing packaging materials before recycling or putting in trash

With more on-line shopping, we need to know what to do with all of the packaging material.

- REDUCE how much you purchase
- SUPPORT businesses that use recycled materials
- REUSE packaging materials

*Some packaging is unavoidable.
Here are some general disposal guidelines...*

Soft Plastic

Plastics that are stretchy can usually be taken to supermarkets and put into the soft plastic recycling bins. This includes the plastic mailing envelopes, air pillows and bubble wrap.

- Large pieces of bubble wrap should be cut into 11x17" or smaller pieces
- Inflated plastic air pillows should be popped
- Padded envelopes that are made of the same materials can be recycled
 - Plastic envelope + bubble wrap
 - Paper envelope + paper cushioning
- Packing Peanuts
 - If the packaging says they are water-soluble starch, you can put them in your home compost or dissolve in water and then throw away
 - If you're not sure what they are made from, it's best to put them into the trash

Polystyrene (Styrofoam)

- Put it in your trash bin

Cardboard

- Flatten or break up boxes and put into curbside recycling
- Compost cardboard in small amounts



Paper

- Non-shredded paper can be recycled in curbside recycling
- Shredded paper should NOT be put loosely in curbside recycling
 - Put in your compost
 - Put in a paper bag, fold the top, tape or staple shut and label "Shredded Paper" before placing in your curbside bin
